

Course Description:

Students will use oral language, written language, and media and technology for expressive, informational, argumentative, critical, and literary purposes. The study of literature and composition is really a process of reflecting upon God, people, the world, and the relationship of all three. The collective and individual application of reading strategies strengthens reading comprehension and develops active readers who appreciate the variety and beauty of the written and spoken language. To support reading development, students will read 1,000,000 words or 25 books or literary equivalents. Their literary selections should include traditional and contemporary literature (both fiction and non-fiction) as well as magazines, newspapers, textbooks, and electronic material. Exposure and analysis of literary elements of fiction, nonfiction, poetry, drama, and the novel establish purpose for reading and broaden a student's experiences and perspectives of the world.

Written and oral responses to literature develop critical thinking, communication skills, personal voice, creativity, knowledge and confidence. Mastery of Grammar skills allow students to comprehend complex material and communicate effectively. Quality writing culminates from prewriting, composing, evaluating, revising, and editing. By applying Biblical truth to the analysis and discussion of all literary works, students will "study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" as instructed in II Timothy 2:15. The student will come to understand the Word of God as the foundation of truth and develop a Christian worldview.

Seventh graders will continue to expand their cross curricular reading fluency and comprehension. Reading across the curriculum develops students' academic and personal interests in different content areas, as well as their understanding and expertise across content areas. Each content area has its own specific vocabulary; Students will apply a variety of reading and comprehension strategies and methods to ensure they develop the subject area specific vocabulary in context to excel across the curriculum.

Teaching Methodology:

Instruction and skill practice will be conducted using several strategies and techniques to ensure each student's learning style is incorporated. Students will participate in whole group instructions, small group direct instruction and application, individual assignments, leveled reading groups, Socratic seminar, and various learning centers (including technology centers).

Evaluation Techniques:

Student's mastery of material will be evaluated through periodic individual summative and formative assessments including daily observations, oral assessments and daily work.

Resources:

Student will use combination of textbooks, worksheets, novels, and technology to support standards.

Novels include The Cay, The House on Mango Street, Where the Lilies Bloom, and/or Zach's Lie.
